


Fig. 1 Impact Factor development








Report of ESTES Congress Grant Winner Shigong Guo



I am a Specialty Registrar in Trauma & Orthopaedic Surgery on the Northwest London Rotation in the United Kingdom. I am currently undertaking higher surgical training at Lister Hospital, Stevenage, under the educational and clinical supervision of Mr RS Deol, Consultant Trauma & Orthopaedic Surgeon and Mr R Sofat, Clinical Director of the Trauma & Orthopaedic Department.

As a young surgeon-in-training, I am honoured that my work has been recognised by your society. I am very grateful to the committee for awarding me this prestigious congress grant and allowing me to present my work on bilateral tibial tubercle avulsion fractures in the active young patient, carried out with my educational supervisor Mr RS Deol.

Participating at the 16th European Congress in Amsterdam, the Netherlands, has given me an invaluable opportunity to learn the latest advances in trauma and emergency surgery from world experts in their fields and also from my peers.

Since my first attendance at the 12th congress in Milan, Italy, I have always been impressed by the uniqueness of this congress for its ability to incorporate experts from a wide range of medical and surgical specialties (e.g. general surgery, orthopaedic surgery, anaesthesia, emergency medicine) and provide a platform to facilitate a multidisciplinary approach to the management of acute trauma.

This congress has been a tremendous educational experience, providing a platform to learn and exchange ideas from leading experts and fellow trainees, in order to advance the development of trauma care for our patients. 

Report of ESTES Congress Grant Winner Damien Massalou



This is the fourth time that I attended an ECTES congress and it is always such an exciting chance for me to share knowledge and experience. I would like to thank ESTES for this award and the Schweizerische Gesellschaft für Traumatologie und Versicherungsmedizin for the grant; it was a fantastic opportunity for me.

In my practice, I am one of the surgeons in charge of the visceral trauma unit of my institution. I would like to participate in its development by implementing our trauma center using evidence-based medicine (if this is possible in trauma patients): direct admittance in the operating room after a prehospital exam by one emergency physician or develop preperitoneal packing for pelvic unstable trauma. I am currently ATLS instructor, assistant in anatomy, and reviewer for various journals.

In the next few years, I hope to travel and perform a fellowship in a civilian trauma center to update my practice and my knowledge because as Voltaire (French author from the 18th century) said, "Travels are good for youth".

I will summarize some of the most interesting moments of this ECTES in Amsterdam.

Military disease

Very impressive reports, particularly one from civilian help in Israel for Syrian civil war casualties: humanity of people defending life, children, attending for nothing and acting only on our Hippocratic oath. As Ambroise Paré said, "everyone who wants to do surgery, must go to war". Military surgical care has always improved the standard of care in civilian casualties. We all learn from their particular experience.

Pancreatic trauma

Very interesting topic: rare and dramatic outcomes when non-diagnosed. What I will remember as an important change in my daily practice is distal pancreatectomy for tail ductal trauma and no place for stenting in right ductal lesions.

Pelvic trauma

Remembering ATLS principles and the remaining challenge of unstable pelvic trauma patients: stop the bleeding, reduce pelvis after only one examination, fix it or stabilize it, etc.

Anorectal injuries

Always have a high index of suspicion and be systematic: CT-TAP. Primary repair if possible. Main blunt trauma patient. Beware of a higher morbidity when delay in diagnosis (6 h) or treatment (12 h).

Poster area

Very interesting case reports or studies. I was particularly interested in two posters on primary preperitoneal packing for non-responders and unstable pelvic trauma patients and one poster on the poorer outcomes after more than 12 h delay after trauma.

Poster awards during wine and cheese sessions

Good oral presentations and discussions with the assembly. Congratulations to our Portuguese colleague for her poster award on a sexual complication 6 months after hysterectomy. And thanks to the organizing committee for the good cheeses, wines and beers!

Opening ceremony

Dr. Asensio was very impressive as a human rights' defender during his honorary member award speech. Such a famous surgeon and professor, telling us about his escape from Castro's working camps and his American dream that he accomplished with the career we all know. Very impressive speech about human rights and the humanity of acute care surgery.
