24th ECTES, Aachen

The 24th European Congress of Trauma and Emergency Surgery took place in Eurogress Aachen (Germany) last April 13 to 15. Under the direction of Congress President Dr. Frank Hildebrand and ESTES president Christine Gaarder, 1,315 registered participants from more than 15 countries could share knowledge in the field of trauma and emergency surgery through 715 submitted abstracts, 35 main sessions, 11 guest symposiums, 6 industry symposiums, 9 special sessions and 8 free communication sessions and 7 parallel poster sessions with 484 presentations.

MUSEC, Polytrauma Course, Interdisciplinary Pelvic Trauma Course, ATLS and Emergency Surgey Course were successfully held in UniklinikRWTH. Universitätsklinikum Aachen as pre-congress courses under the organization of Dr. Klemens Horst.

European White Book on Polytrauma Management – Setting Standards for Trauma Care Across Europe

The implementation and maturation of inclusive trauma systems covering the entire treatment chain from prehospital care to rehabilitation result in a higher quality of care, improved survival rates and better functional outcomes after severe trauma.

Besides well-coordinated treatment strategies as well as specific personnel and structural requirements, a functioning trauma system also must provide research, quality improvement, education and prevention programs to ensure a constant development of trauma care. The degree of implementation and the quality of trauma systems have been found to vary substantially between European countries.

Unfortunately, in a significant number of European health care systems, structures for coordinated trauma care are still lacking partly or entirely. Due to the representation of experts from thirty-three national societies from 27 countries with different European trauma systems, the European Society of Trauma and Emergency Surgery (ESTES) is predestined to provide key elements in terms of the aforementioned aspects of trauma care in Europe. Therefore, the aim of this collection is to provide a reliable description on how to organize and optimize trauma systems from the prehospital setting to rehabilitation under consideration of necessary key elements for their further development, such as prevention, education, research and quality improvement. Emergency Surgery Course

After successful ESC courses in Laussane (Switzerland), Aachen (Germany) and Viseu (Portugal), new course editions are planned in Sevilla (Spain) October 17-18th and Craiova (Romania) November 10-11th.

The ESC® (joint collaboration between ESTES and AAST) aims to aid surgeons in non-trauma emergency surgery by providing the know-how and the decisionmaking skills necessary for daily practice. The course consists of theoretical sessions, case scenarios plus state-of-the-art videos and is especially designed in an interactive format to present and actively discuss management of the general surgery emergencies encountered when on call. The 2 day course reviews the current literature on management of these emergencies and with interactive case discussions provides tips and tricks to improve surgical skills.

Emergency Surgery Section

The Emergency Surgery Section is about to launch a new Snapshot study, the Snap NSTI: International Prospective Observational Cohort Study of Necrotizing Soft Tissue Infections. A non-randomized time-bound study addressing epidemiology and management of NSTI. More information comming soon about this and other snapshot studies.



Notably, several of these connections have already led to promising leads for a randomized controlled trial currently being developed within our department.

The second day started early with another series of highly interesting lectures. A highlight for me personally was the YESTES (Young ESTES) meeting. This session was particularly relevant to my current career stage, offering practical advice and valuable insights on research, career development, and international collaboration. That evening, the congress social event provided another great opportunity to meet trauma surgeons from across Europe in a more informal setting. Again, I was able to expand my network significantly. Given that I had to present my poster the next morning, I ensured an early night to be fully prepared. My poster presentations on the final day were facilitated through an innovative e-poster system. This setup, with headphones for audience members, allowed for clear communication despite the busy atmosphere, and made the session very accessible and effective. Presenting my work and receiving feedback from international colleag ues was both encouraging and inspiring for future research projects.

Trauma Traveling Fellowship Project

The VTS is designing a Trauma Traveling Fellowship. Visiting a centre of excellence in trauma care may improve surgeon's care of injured patients and motivate them to pursue a career as a trauma surgeon. However, funding and opportunities are limited for surgeons to visit centres of excellence in trauma care. A Trauma Traveling Fellowship would increase exposure to world-class trauma care and provide the opportunity and funding to allow surgeons to benefit. As a first step the VTS, with support from the Research and YESTES Sections has designed a survey for all ESTES members that aims to assess the aspirations, expectations, and perceived challenges of prospective fellows and host centers for an ESTES Trauma Traveling Fellowship, guided by CFIR and RE-AIM/PRISM constructs.
