

EGS-READI is designed as a pan-European environmental scan of system-level readiness, focusing on the structural, digital, and governance determinants that shape the adoption of enabling technologies in emergency surgery. Letter from the treasurer

Dear friends and colleagues, dear ESTES members,

At the end of my terms as ESTES treasurer it is my duty to handover the treasury this January. I understand it is also my debt to address you with a brief summary of what this six years have been for me.

My purposes as treasurer have always been to keep a judicious control of the society expenses for what was in my hand, giving advise to the Board, to promote scientific research and educational activities, and to reinforce ESTES Office structure with the invaluable collaboration of our Manager, Mrs. Manuela Walland to whom I have no other but words of praise.

When in January 2020, I succeeded the former treasurer, Dr. Hayato Kurihara, there were important ongoing issues, as the recovery of the monetary trust reserves in Lyon, solved with Drs. Kurihara and Voglio's help, and the transition process from ESTES Belgium to ESTES Austria, definitely closed in 2023 with the Belgian Tax Office and being an important economic expense for the society in legal support.

Early in 2020, the Covid 19 shook our lives, and the congress in Oslo had to be postponed. The Board had to face tough times trying to damage control the situation and the contract with our PCO, Conventus was renegotiated. This was accomplished thanks to the former General Secretary Dr. Klaus Wendt and the other Executive Board members. At the end, this assured ESTES positive balance results for congresses since then.

Although times also turned difficult for obtaining financial support from the industry, the main value for the society have always been their members, both institutional and individual. Since Covid, a huge effort has been made to increase this memberships with investments in ESTES courses, online educational activities and social media. I want to thank Dr. Diego Mariani and the many ESTES members involved in this initiatives for their tremendous job.

In the other hand, ESTES participation in Nightingale's Project has been in my opinion one of this period's main achievements. I want to mention Drs. Roberto Faccincani and Jonathan Tilsed for their tenasion in driving us through this successful initiative.

Our society is nowadays plenty of ongoing activities throughout its different Sections and Committees, probably younger, bigger and healthier in economic terms that was in the past. I feel myself a small part of its soul. It has been a tremendous honor and pleasure to serve as treasurer for ESTES. I want to thank all ESTES Board members and friends for their support and wish a successful term to my successor Dr. Carl Montan.



Who can be an individual member?

The society is open for all doctors within specialities involved in trauma and emergency surgery (all surgical fields, anaesthesiology, radiology and emergency, military and disaster medicine). Of course also doctors in training are very welcome as members. Moreover, the society is open for non-physicians such as nurses, paramedics, ambulance and pre-hospital staff.

What does it cost to be an individual member, and what do I get for it?

The annual membership fee is € 120,- for specialists and € 85,- for doctors under training and for non-doctors.

Membership benefits are:

- A significantly reduced registration fee to the annual congress of the society
- Registration for endorsed courses and meetings at a reduced fee
- Free annual online subscription to the official forum of the society, the "European Journal of Trauma and Emergency surgery". The journal comprises 6 issues per year including regular information from the society. For the printed version, a special price of € 30,- per year can be offered.
